Our organizations stand united and have begun to identify the many ways we can assist during this difficult time.

Lambda Theta Alpha and Lambda Theta Phi has continued their efforts in the areas of service and collecting donations which will be distributed to Habitat for Humanity International, the Haitian Relief Mission. Habitat for Humanity International has provided assistance to Haiti for over 27 years. Habitat has also begun to respond by addressing immediate relief efforts and long-term shelter solutions. In addition, Habitat will be cleaning the areas affected by the earthquake, providing shelter kits that will assist in immediate repairs to damaged homes, and provide families with transitional shelter that would serve as a permanent base structure for families over time.
