UNITED STATES' FIRST NATIONAL LATIN FRATERNITY TO HOLD CONFERENCE IN PUERTO RICO

PASSAIC, NJ, June 5, 2007 - Lambda Theta Phi Latin Fraternity, Inc., the First National Latin Fraternity in the United States will hold its 2007 National Brotherhood Conference in San Juan, Puerto Rico from June 7 to 10. Lambda Theta Phi is a "traditional" college-based fraternal organization, but was founded and incorporated as a "Latin" fraternity with a mission to serve the Latin community and provide the kind of culturally-based support to college students that had not previously been available within in other college fraternities. Over the years the organizations has attracted thousands of members, most of who are now alumni and are part of a network of Latin professionals involved in community service and activism, mentoring students, and professional development.

This year's conference is expected to attract hundreds of college students and professionals from across the United States. They will gather to discuss topics that include the state of their organization, political activism, financial investment and various other topics. Speakers will include Miami businessman and international political activist Agustin Garcia, who is also one of the Founders of Lambda Theta Phi, and former prosecutor, Pennsylvania State Cabinet Member and Author Brother Jesus Peña, Esq.

In the past, Lambda Theta Phi has held conferences at venues across the nation with various corporate sponsors; this is the first one to be held outside the continental United States. In addition, it will include an awards banquet on Saturday. Lambda Theta Phi President Byron Bustos said: "Although we were founded at a college campus in the United States, we have always maintained ties with our families in Latin America. Many of our community service projects have helped communities in Latin America and recent immigrants; as well as Latinos in the US. We have always envisioned having conferences in Latin America and we hope that Puerto Rico is just the first of many such events."

Although the majority of the membership is men of Latin descent, the organization also includes members from nations across the world. In every sense, diversity can be found among the membership that includes: doctors, lawyers, educators, law enforcement; entertainers, entrepreneurs, councilmen, authors, scientist, engineers, artist, activist, and a United States Senator.

Founded in 1975 at Kean University in Union, New Jersey, Lambda Theta Phi Latin Fraternity, Inc. is the first national recognized Greek-letter organization founded as a Latin Fraternity. The membership of Lambda Theta Phi is open to all college men who support its values of scholarship, respect for all culture, community service, and the advancement and fair treatment of Latinos. Lambda Theta Phi was the first Latin Fraternity to be recognized by the North-American Inter-Fraternity Conference (NIC) and today, has over 90 Chapters and Colonies in, Arizona, California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.
